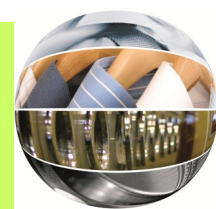

Do You Remember the Letter Regarding the Campaign For More Cleaning!
These letters, contained within an e-mail, went out to Guild members and similar letters were also be sent out to members of the Textile Services Association and to members of the Society of Laundry Engineers and Allied Trades asking about your views on dry cleaning volumes. The question asked was "are they starting to decline?" These letters are considered to be a prelude to starting a campaign to raise the awareness of the value of having items cleaned. You may remember in previous issues of the E-Bulletin we have made reference to the "Man in A White Suit". Is he in fact going to become a reality?

Please respond to the letter, your views are important to us and at present there has not been a lot of reaction, which could be indicated to mean you are happy with the volumes of dry cleaning you are currently receiving. If we do not hear from you we do not know what you are thinking?

Amber Alerts Still proving to be popular to members when they receive the information but there is still a reticence in sending in information on items that have failed, or given trouble, when brought in for cleaning. We value your input and promise

Ⓜ not to divulge your details to anyone so that others are unaware of the origin of the information. We published two alerts in August and the second proved to be very popular, mainly because it had a seldom seen symbol, double underlined Circle W, and the colour ran in the hydrocarbon solvent the cleaner chose to use, but tests showed that it was not fast to water either. On unpicking the garment it was revealed that the loose colour was from a tape used to fix down the seams. At the Scottish Conference to be held in September it is planned to have a session where we can debate problem garments that cause cleaners concern.

Members To Lose Facilities The time is approaching when members who have failed to renew their subscription for the current year will be taken off the lists of members and will no longer get the Amber Alerts, regular bulletins, and Guild Newsletters, and other benefits of membership.
